CROSS-EXAMINED

Q. A.	The previous witness told the Court that the SUS were kept in their huts after 4 o'clock' Do you agree with that? That was when the general working parties generally came in the hut On my job it was 4 o'clock when I got in and sometimes after that.
Q.	You told the Court it was sometime after 4 c'clock?
A.	Yes.
Q.	Do you recall VE Day?
A.	Yes.
Q.	How did the SUS first learn about VE Day?
A.	By a news bulletin sent around about noon.
Q.	What hap ened?
A.	.There was a lot of noise and mess tins thrown out the window.
Q.	I suppose there was lots of talking and shouting.
A.	Yes, Sir.
Q. A.	All began to wonder when they would be going home? Yes.
Q. A.	Was there any relaxation by the staff that day? Did they let you talk more? Yes, the staff let things go easy.
Q.	As a matter of fact there were quite a few smoking?
A.	Yes.
Q.	Did the staff do anything about it?
A.	No.
Q. A.	So official or unofficial they didn't do anything about it? \mathbb{N}_{O} .
Q.	Were the staff smoking on duty?
. A.	I don't know, Sir.
Q.	Were they excited?
A.	Yes.
Q.	Just one of the boys that day?
A.	Yes, sir, about the same.
Q.	Do you recall the Summary of Evidence in this case?
A.	Yes.
Q. A.	Do you recall saying "On the night of 8 May 45 some SUS approached me and axked if I wanted to make a break with them. SUS Jones was one of the party but I could not say if he asked me or someone else asked me if I wanted to make a break". Is that correct? Yes, Sir.
Q. A.	From that it may have been the accused or one of the others? Yes.
Q.	You don't know who it was?
A.	No, I don't know
Q.	On the 9th May were the SUS still excited about VE day?
A.	Yes.
Q.	Did the same relaxation of rules seem to apply that day?
A.	I don't know, Sir, I was away from the hut.
