Dominion-Provincial relations; discussions with British Columbia

1. The Minister of Finance reported that, since this subject had last been discussed at the meeting of December 3rd, the Prime Minister and he had held discussions with the Premier of British Columbia.

Mr. Hart had proposed that, in view of the special circumstances of British Columbia, the Federal government's budget offer might be amended in their case by adding to the option available to the province to receive 150% of the annual amount payable under the wartime tax agreement, the "escalator" provision based on increases in population and gross national product.
