11. The tapernacle of God consists of those who dwell in the heavens. The heaven dwellers are seen in Revelation, 4:4:

"And round about the throne were four and twenty seats (thrones) and upon the seats I saw four and twenty elders sitting, clothed in white raiment: and they had on their heads crowns of gold."

These are kings and priests.

Who these kings and priests are is in scribed in Revelation, 5:8-10.

"The four and twenty elders fell down before the Lamb, having every one of them
harps, and golden vials full of odors, which
are the prayers of saints" (which prayers they
present in the exercise of their priestly office.
Notice here, and notice it well, the church
presents the prayers of the saints—not the
saints the prayers of the church.)

"And they sung a new song, saying, Thou art worthy to take the book, and to open the seals thereof: for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood, out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation; and hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on (over) the earth."

These redeemed people are the church.

The church then is the tabernacle of God in heaven.
