

- 1821 Death of his mother
- 1822 "Odes et poésies diverses." Pension of 1000 francs
Marries Adèle Foucher (October 12)
- 1823 His first novel "Han d'Islande." A second pension, of
2000 francs
- 1824 His daughter Léopoldine born (d. 1843)
- 1826 His son Charles born (d. 1871)
- 1828 Death of his father
His son François-Victor born (d. 1873)
- 1830 His daughter Adèle born. "Hernani" produced,
February 25
- 1841 Elected to the French Academy
- 1843 "Les Burgraves" acted, March 7. Léopoldine and her
husband, Charles Vacquerie, drowned in the Seine,
September 4
- 1845 Is created a peer of France. Devotes himself to
politics
- 1848 Elected to the Constituent Assembly
- 1849 Elected to the Legislative Assembly. Goes over to the
radical party in opposition to Louis Napoleon
- 1851 Helps to organize opposition to Napoleon after the
Coup d'État of December 2. Flees to Brussels,
December 11
- 1852-1855 Lives at Marine Terrace in Jersey
- 1855-1870 Settles down at Hauteville House, Guernsey
- 1868 Death of his wife
- 1870 Returns to Paris, September 5, after Napoleon's de-
feat and downfall. Remains in Paris throughout the
siege
- 1871 His son Charles dies, leaving two children, Georges
and Jeanne
- 1873 His son François-Victor dies
- 1876 Elected senator from Paris
- 1885 Died, May 22. Buried in the Pantheon
