## HUNTINGDON.

An incorporated village in the township of Hinchinbrooke, County of Huntingdon, pleasantly situated on both sides of the Chateaugay. It has a good water power which is utilized to a great extent by mills, &c. There is a large foundry and agricultural implement works here, also machine shops, saw and grist mill, also organ factory, several carriage factories and a Hame factory lately started, being the only factory of the kind in the Province. There are five churches here and the school buildings are among the finest in the Townships. There is also a good local newspaper called *The Gleaner* published here. Independent-Liberal in politics. There are two good hotels in the village, one of them "Mrs. Moir's," having perhaps the finest hall in the Townships in connection with it. Has also telegraph and telephone offices. There is also a Circuit Court held here and the Huntingdon Agricultural Society No. 1 has its fair ground and buildings here. The Allen Grove Cheese Combination also have an office here operating 33 factories on this side of the St. Lawrence. Mails twice daily from Montreal and the south, also one from Franklin Centre. Distance from Montreal 50 miles, Ormstown 10 miles, Dundee 12 miles, Franklin Centre 16 miles. Population 1600.
