Resolved, that the sum of one hundred pounds be granted for the relicf and assistance of John Mount (on his petition.)

Resolved, that the sum of twenty two pounds eighteen shillings and three pence be granted to Lieut. Colonel Wetmore, for defraying expences incurred in apprehending deserters from the embodied Militia stationed at Saint John in the year 1808.

Resolved, that the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds be granted for building or repairing the gaol in the County of St. John.

Resolved, that the sum of two hundred pounds be granted to His Honor the President to be laid out in removing the Split Rock in the Falls, if on the report of the Commissioners His Honor the President should think proper.

And that the Committee requested leave to sit again. The report is accepted. And ordered that the above-mentioned resolutions be sent up to the Council for their concurrence.

Message from the Council informing the House that the Council have concurred in passing the Bill in addition to the Act to prevent the incumbering or filling up of Harbours with an amendment, which being read in the House, was concurred in and ordered that the Bill be returned to the Council:

Mr. Wetmore, by leave, brought a Bill in addition to and in amendment of an Act intituled "An Act to make more effectual provision for repairing the aboideau or bridge across the Marsh Creek in the City and County of St. John." Which was read a first time.

The House then adjourned until to-morrow morning at 10 o'Clock.
