London, July 16.—(Via Reuter's Ottawa Agency).—Percy Harris. M.P., speaking in the House, suggested in view of the arrival of such large reinforcements from America, British youths should not be sent to France until they were 19 years old. He asked at what age the Americans were called up and whether the French of the 1920 class were yet in the trenches. J. L. MacPherson regretted that the present circumstances would not permit of the adoption of the suggestion. He declined to say that youths under 19 would not be sent to the front line. He understood that no Frenchmen of the 1920 class were yet put in the trenches and also he believed that the minimum age for American recruits was 21.
