MRS. T. B. SHEPHERD. The Splendid Success of a California

Woman In Floriculture. Mrs. Theodosia Burr Shepherd of Ventura, Cal., has for twenty years and more lived a life unceasingly given to the unfolding and evolution of floral plant life, adding vigor and grace to the older types and producing yet oth-

er charms in foliage and fragrance and shades of color in her new creations, Angus Hall, a forceful Iowa lawyer and congressman, afterward chief justice of Nebraska, was the father of Mrs. Shepherd. Her mother she lost when but three years of age. Her father named her Theodosia Burr because of admiration of the domestic heroine of the Revolution, whose filial devotion won the admiration of the whole country in spite of the unpatri-



otic career of her father. Judge Hall was a fond flower lover and led his daughter to study their nature and love them as he did. Her school education was received at Ruth Bryan's seminary in Batavia, N. Y. The dream of her girlhood was of a conservatory "all her own," and her frail health induced her to come after her marriage to California. Her husband found a home for them in Ventura, where her dream has long been more than real-

On the land purchased for her by her husband Mrs. Shepherd began the cultivation of flowers in a scientific way, gradually broadening out until she was exchanging California plants, seaweeds and curios with eastern and European florists in furtherance of her esire to add all the beautiful things obtainable to her groups of garden treasures. She was aided in her daily task by the ready help of her children, a son and three daughters. She soon established a good business and in a few years gained an bonorable name as a flower evolutionist of great ability. The honor of being the pioneer florist of south-

ern California belongs to her. Begonias are Mrs. Shepherd's favorite flowers, and twenty-one new creations of this beautiful plant now stand to her credit, some of them marvals of beauty and vigor, her Marjorie Daw ranking as a wonder in the floral world, while her new tree begonias, six to ten feet high, even the leaves of which seem to be illuminated with brilliant colors, command like admira-

Her work in the evolution of nasturtiums has resulted in the giant flowered Sunlight, the giant Moonlight and Caprice, bought by William Atlee Burpee, the great Philadelphia florist, who visited her place and made generous recognition of her work in his catalogue for 1900. She has also other marvels in nasturtiums. Her new creations in geraniums number twentyfour, in chrysanthemums twelve, in poppies three, one of which cannot be described without seeming exaggeration.-Los Angeles Herald.

The Skin and Massage.

There is no reason whatever why a good skin should not be retained until well into middle age. The reason it is not is because few women realize the efficacy of arresting the natural process of decay by artificial means, or, rather, of counteracting the withering effect of our artificial living, in time. During youth all sorts of abuses may be indulged in with impunity. The natural health of youth defles them, but when this growing time is past and nature no onger supplies the body with multiple force there must be deterioration uness we take some measures ourselves to preserve the beauty of youth and to arrest the advance of age tokens. One of the best means possible for this, where the skin is concerned, is massage. This supplies the skin with the blood which in youth is supplied unconsciously, and it preserves the tissues and texture as long as it is employed. Such massage as this need be but little else than pressure, to call the blood to the surface of the skin and to keep it alive and active. With the tips of the fingers, at least once a day, every inch of the space on the face and neck should be gently but firmly pressed and kneaded, not so as to cause soreness, but so that the blood is called to the very surface and every smallest cell is flooded. It may be done in bathing the face, if no wash cloth be employed, by rubbing the soap into the skin with the finger tips and then rinsing all this off.

Well Conducted Household. On the door of the linen, china, glass and silver closets should be placed a list of their contents. When new articles are added, a record should be made and the same done when they are lost or worn out.
