No merchant would, for a stipulated sum, allow a customer to take from his box of tea what he wished, or from a roll of cloth as many yards as he could carry away, more particularly if the supply was limited as our water supply has limited, as our water supply has been and is, by the lack of filter

been and is, by the lack of filter capacity.

As to the matter in question, the Commissioners, I feel sure, have no desire to teverse their past policy of granting a fiberal supply of water for lawn service, but only to discourage or prevent a misuse of the water. You state that the change is aggravated by the fact that these services were put in under the approval of the Commissioners, but at the cost of the householder, who has been in no way to blame. Now, I may say that with very few exceptions, these same parties were adceptions, these same parties were advised, at the time of making application, to put their whole water service on the meter, as the time would surely come when it would have to surely come when it would have to be made compulsory. Some accepted the advice, but others did not; many of them, no doubt, from the desire to obtain all the water possibhle, even at the expense of the other water-takers. And they have done so to such an extent that there is no doubt that the city has time and again been in serious jeopardy from fire, as I do not know of any that complied with the by-law in regard to turning off sprinkling services on

fire, as I do not know of any that complied with the by-law in regard to turning off sprinkling services on an alarm of fire. But we are informed that some turned their services on so as to take advantage of the greater pressure, and against this tremendous output all over the city it was found impossible to furnish the fire pressure required by the insurance underwriters, and I wish the citizens at large to fully understand that this among other actions of the Commissioners has been taken in their best interests.

One other matter I wish to mention before concluding is, that the Water Commissioners have always considered that it was better to urge compliance with the by-laws by milder methods than bringing the offender before the Police Magistrate, and in this they have erred, as possibly the more severe method would have been the better, and probably will now have to be adopted, on account of your nawiss policy of inciting opposition to the very proper action of the Commissioners.

WAR VESSELS ON GREAT LAKES. United States Would Use Speedy Gun-

Washington, June 20.—The gunboat Don Juan de Austria, now in New Hampshire waters, is the war vessel which the State Department is trying to have located on the great lakes as an additional ship for the use of the naval militia in that section of the country.
