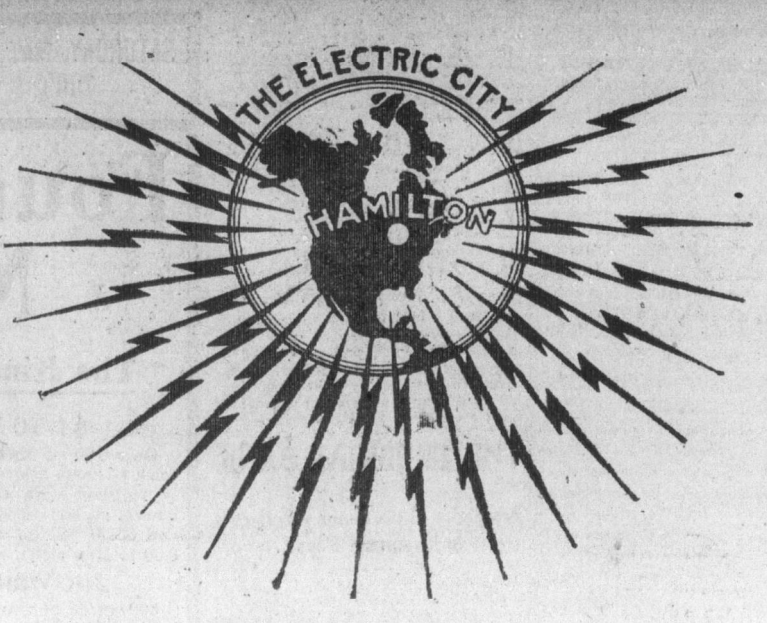

FOUND DEAD.

Inquest of Stratford Man Opened Yesterday.

Stratford, Ont., May 27.—An inquest was opened this afternoon on the body of Joseph Turner, Cobourg street, who was found last evening lying dead on the floor of the kitchen. His wife was away at the time at the bedside of her dying grandmother.

Deceased had been singularly unfortunate in many respects during the past few years. He was a member of the fire department for 25 years, and about seven years ago, while fighting a fire, he lost the sight of an eye in an explosion which occurred at the McCarty machine shop at Ontario street. Mr. Turner had suffered almost continuously since that time with pains in the head, and the shock seriously affected his nerves and heart. On Monday last he was again the victim of an unfortunate accident by which the sight of his other eye was almost destroyed, a firecracker in the hands of one of the boys exploding near his face. This accident preyed on his mind to such an extent that he was completely unnerved during Tuesday and Wednesday.

STEEL PLANT.

Algoma Co. Has Placed Orders For \$500,000 Worth of Machinery.

Pittsburg, Pa., May 27.—Another move toward centering the iron and steel industry of the United States on the borders of the Great Lakes was made today, when a contract was closed by the Algoma Steel Company for \$500,000 worth of heavy steel machinery to be delivered at Sault Ste. Marie, Canada, as quickly as possible. It is the intention of the Philadelphians and the Londoners back of this plant to have two immense steel mills in Canada turning out bars and other steel products by Nov. 1 next.
