Canadian Pacific Steamships.

This question of establishing a line of steamships between Vancouver and Hong Kong, in connection with the Canadian Pacific Railway, which has, for some time, engaged the attention of the Canadian and Imperial Governments, is one of vast importance, not only to the Dominion of Canada, but to the whole British Empire.

The proposed service is to consist of three parts: A new and swift route to connect Great Britain with the Atlantic terminus of the Canadian Pacific Railway; a line of fast-sailing steamers to ply between Vancouver and Yokohama and China, with extensions to India and Australia; and an independent British cable from Vancouver and New Zealand or Sydney to the Sandwich Islands, thus forming a complete chain of communication round the world.

The proposed service is to consist of three parts: A new and swift route to connect Great Britain with the Atlantic terminus of the Canadian Pacific Railway; a line of fast-sailing steamers to ply between Vancouver and Yokohama and China, with extensions to India and Australia; and an independent British cable from Vancouver and New Zealand or Sydney to the Sandwich Islands, thus forming a complete chain of communication round the world.

The Gloucester Fisheries.

SCARCELY a newspaper one picks up but contains an account of fearful suffering and narrow escapes from death of fishermen found drifting about in dories; or of the probable loss of some fishing vessel with all on board. The present year seems to be prolific of casualties of this kind; so much so, indeed, that the New England newspapers are beginning to notice that the accidents to the fishing fleet are unusually numerous.

Newfoundland and Confederation.

It is reported that the feeling in favor of entering the Confederation of the British North American Provinces, is now gaining ground in Newfoundland. It will be remembered that, owing to the disadvantage at which the fishermen of that island had to compete, in the markets of the world, with the French fishermen, owing to the bounty by which the latter were protected, a bill passed the Colonial Legislature and was sent to the Imperial Parliament for assent.

The speech of Professor Weldon on the Queen's County case was a masterly exposition of the legal aspect of the question. His contention that the case should be referred to the courts was rejected by the majority at any time to confirm in his seat a member who might not be legally entitled to it.

A BILL has been introduced into the House of Commons by Sir John Macdonald, respecting a special department, to be called the Department of Trade and Commerce.
