Salisbury Appointed Premier.

John Ruskin, the celebrated author, is dying.

Salisbury has been appointed Prime Minister, and Lord Cadogan will probably be Minister for the Colonies.

At a meeting of the Conservatives to-day, Salisbury offered the Premiership to Hartington, if he would form a coalition.

Balmaceda, Liberal, has been elected President of Chili. Over forty lives were lost in the election riots.

LONDON, July 27.

The suit of Cyrus W. Field against James Gordon Bennett, for libel, was tried this day, and the jury gave a verdict in favor of Mr. Field for \$25,000 damages, and costs.

**DIRECTIONS FOR MAKING BREAD:**

Put one quart of milk or water and two-thirds of a teaspoonful of yeast; add flour to the thickness of batter, and let it rise over night; then add flour enough to knead softly twenty minutes, or until it will not cling to the board, as it requires much more kneading than Winter Wheat Flour. Let it rise in the pan, then make into small loaves, and let it rise again. Bake in a moderate oven. Be sure and not let it stand in the oven after it is done, and we will promise you a most beautiful, sweet, white bread. This flour will work very much better by thoroughly drying it out. Let it set on the back of the stove, or some other warm place, twenty-four hours, and you will be surprised at the difference it will make in either bread or cake. Some good cooks keep a lot of dried out flour on hand all the time and regard it a great secret.

**DIRECTIONS FOR MAKING THE BEST YEAST:**

Boil a handful of hops in two quarts of water ten minutes. Then strain, and to the liquor add six good-sized grated potatoes, one cup of sugar and one tablespoonful of salt. Let it simmer one half hour; when lukewarm add one cup of good yeast, and let it rise.
