Any monies received after June 1st will be held to provide for emergencies now unforeseen in

ance with the suggestion made by Mr. Hoover, Chairman of the Relief Commission, who is now in Washington and has the approval of His Majesty's Government and the Belgian Minister.

During the existence of the Committee over £2,400,000, subscribed throughout the British Empire for the relief of our oppressed allies in Belgium, has passed through its hands. The second annual meeting will be held at the Mansion House on June 15th, when opportunity will be taken 24 May, 1917. to express gratitude to those committees and individuals who have co-operated with such marked devotion in
