BERLIN, Nov. 5. The note of the Supreme Council calling upon Germany to send to Paris delegates to sign a protocol agreeing to carry out certain unfulfilled provisions of the armistice regarding the surrender of railway material, agricultural machinery, etc., and to make compensation for the destruction of the fleet at Scapa Flow, has been received here. The note calls for the surrender of five light cuisers, floating docks and small destroyers, as a penalty for the destruction of the warships at Scapa Flow.

OHIO GOES DRY AGAIN.

COLUMBUS, Nov. 5. 
