be. The Helsted—as he had no doubt he would be—he intended to give the Government a fair and liberal support, because he thought they deserved it, as they had brought it? and passed many measures which he heartily approved of which were of the greatest benefit to the country, and which no reasonable man could find fault with. In the heat of elections things were often said which had better be unsaid. He hoped that no word derogatory to any one would escape from him, and that when the contest was over they would all be as friendly as they were before. He would support good measures, come from what source they may. They could scarcely expect much good from the Opposition, but if by chance they did introduce any good measure he would support it. Objection was being made to this Government that they had increased the expenditure. If it had been increased was there not a necessity for it. Had they not experience in their own cases how as they progressed their expenses necessarily increased, and her expenses must necessarily increase in the same ratio. Take for example the item of immigration. The policy of the Government has been to induce as large an immigration as possible, and the increased expenditure in that way has been money well spent. Then look at the policy of this Government with regard to the Grown Lands. There were very few farmers before him who had not received large benefits from the Government made a sort of valuation of these lands, but the values were rather increased than diminished. 
