It has frequently been maintained that wetting coal increases the amount of heat given out in combustion, but a careful enquiry has shown, first, that there is no increase of heat; second, that a loss of heat always follows addition of water; third, both the amount of heat and the temperature of the fire are considerably diminished.

The granite soldier who is to surmount the national monument at the lattlefeld of Antietam has been completed, and is claimed to be the largest figure in sculpture out of Egypt. He weighs over thirty tons, and is twenty-one and a half feet high. The gun he holds is sighteen feet long, and his shoet three feet in length. The face is smooth shaven, except having a heavy moustache, and is that of a resolute man.

A Mohammedan mission is to be established in Chicago. It is said that no follower of the great prophet dure take that which is not his own, and we have smyle historical evidence to prove that Mohammedans live up to their creed in this respect. The mission will be a boon to Chicago.


