### BY-LAW NO 2

A BY-LAW IMPOSING A DOG TAX AND  
FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A POUND  
AND THE REGULATING THEREOF.

1. No person shall suffer any horse, mule, bull, ox, sheep, goat, pig, or any other cattle or fowl to run at large in the limits of the City of Fernie.  
2. There shall be a public pound established in the City of Fernie and it shall be maintained at such place and upon such premises as the council shall from time to time by resolution appoint.  
3. It shall be lawful for anyone to drive or carry to the city pound any animal or animals mentioned in section (1) hereof if found running at large within the limits of the City of Fernie and it shall be the duty of the Pound Keeper to impound every animal so brought and detain the same as in section eight (8) hereby provided.  
4. It shall be lawful for and shall be the duty of the Pound Keeper to impound any animal mentioned in section one (1) hereof if found running at large within the limits of the City of Fernie and detain the same until the owner or owners thereof shall have paid the damages, fines and expenses mentioned in Section nine (9) hereof.  
5. The owner of animal, other than a fowl, taken running at large shall pay to the Pound Keeper the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) for each animal so taken and impounded together with Fifty cents (50c) a day for each such animal to cover the expenses of the said Pound Keeper in providing food, water and shelter for the same; And the owner of every fowl taken running at large shall pay the pound keeper the sum of twenty-five cents (25c) for each fowl so taken and impounded; together with the sum of 15c. a day for each such fowl to cover the expenses of the said Pound Keeper in providing food, water and shelter for the same.  
6. It shall be the duty of the Pound Keeper daily to furnish such animals good and sufficient food, water and shelter during the whole time such animals are impounded.  
7. In all cases the Pound Keeper shall within twenty-four hours and not before six hours after the animal has been impounded cause a notice, written or printed or partly written and partly printed to be affixed to the Pound gates and on the outside door of the Court House and City Hall and Post Office which notice shall give a particular description of the animal impounded and shall specify when & where same shall be sold if not redeemed and if the owner of such animal or some other person on his or her behalf shall not within five days after such notice shall have been affixed as aforesaid redeem the same by paying such damages, fines fees and expenses as may be fixed by this by-law it shall be lawful for such Pound Keeper to cause such animals to be sold and after deducting such damages fines fees and expenses to pay the overplus (if any) to the owner or owners of such animals if known and if not known to pay the same to the City Clerk.  
8. The Pound Keeper shall be entitled to the following fees for posting any such notices and for any such sale:  
For posting the required notices as provided by section twelve hereof where required Fifty cents (50c.)  
For every sale of distress Fifty cents (50c.)  
9. If any person without authority of law and without first paying the damages fines fees and expenses imposed by this by-law takes or attempts to take any animals lawfully impounded out of the pound without the Pound Keeper's consent he shall be deemed guilty of an infraction of this By-Law.  
10. DOGS.  
11. Every owner of a dog in the City of Fernie shall annually pay to the City Clerk or person authorized to collect the same, for the general purposes of the city a tax of three dollars (\$3.00) for each dog and Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each bitch owned by him and upon payment of such tax shall be entitled to receive a metallic plate having raised or stamped thereon the word "Fernie" or such other design as the council shall from time to time by resolution appoint, and figures indicating the year for which the said tax has been paid, together with a number corresponding with the number under which the said dog or bitch is registered in the book kept for that purpose: Provided always that during the remainder of the year 1904 owners of dogs and bitches paying the tax imposed imposed by this By-Law for the said year shall be entitled to receive a rebate in the sum of Two Dollars (\$2.00) for Dogs and (\$3.00) for a Bitch in respect of the tax so paid by him for each dog and bitch respectively.  
12. No owner of a dog or bitch shall suffer or permit such animal to run at large in the City of Fernie unless and until he has paid the tax required by section fifteen (15) hereof and unless such dog or bitch shall have around its neck a collar or strap to which shall be attached the metallic plate mentioned in said section 15 and any dog or bitch found running at large contrary to this provision shall be liable to be captured and disposed of as hereinafter provided.  
13. It shall be lawful for and shall be the duty of the Pound Keeper and any

other person duly authorized to impound any dog or bitch running at large in the City of Fernie contrary to the provisions of this By-Law and the owner or possessor of such dog or bitch shall be entitled to redeem the same within Seventy-two (72) hours from the time of capture by paying for the use of the city a fine of One Dollar (1.00) for each dog or bitch and the sum of Twenty-five cents (25c.) per day for the keep thereof and procuring a license for the same under the provisions of section Fifteen (15) hereof and if the same is not redeemed within Seventy-two (72) hours after such impounding then every such dog or bitch shall be killed or disposed of in such manner as the Council shall approve by the person appointed for that purpose.  
14. When the owner of a dog or bitch impounded under the provisions of this By-Law produces, within Seventy-two (72) hours after such impounding, satisfactory evidence that he has complied with the provisions of section (15) hereof in respect of such dog or bitch he shall be entitled to redeem the same on providing property and expenses.  
15. The owner of any bitch in heat who shall suffer or permit the same to run at large while in that condition shall be subject to the penalties imposed by this By-Law.  
16. Any person guilty of an infraction or violation of any of the provisions of this By-Law, upon summary conviction before the Police Magistrate of the City a Justice of Peace or other authority having jurisdiction within the City, shall forfeit and pay, in the discretion of the convicting Police Magistrate, Justice of Peace or other competent authority for every such infraction or violation a fine or penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment the offender may be committed to the common jail in the City of Fernie there to be imprisoned for any time in the discretion of the convicting Police Magistrate, Justice of Peace or other competent authority for a term not exceeding Two (2) months with or without hard labor unless such fine or penalty and cost, including the costs of Commitment and conveyance to the said common jail, are sooner paid. The Police Magistrate, Justice of Peace or other competent authority before whom a prosecution is had for any offence against this By-Law or any of the provisions thereof may convict the offender upon the oath or affirmation of any credible witness and shall award the whole or any part of the fine or penalty imposed by this By-Law as he thinks fit with the costs of prosecution and may by warrant under his hand and seal cause any fine pecuniary penalty and costs, or costs only if not forthwith paid to be levied by distress and sale of goods and chattels of the offender. In case of there being no distress found out of which the fine or penalty can be levied the Police Magistrate, Justice of Peace or other competent authority may commit the offender to the Common Jail in the City of Fernie for the term of Two (2) months or any part thereof with or without labor.

### MORRISSEY NEWS.

On Friday last Robert Hewitt, a boy of about 14 years of age, met with a serious accident at the Carbonado mines, resulting in the loss of his right arm. Hewitt along with some other boys was employed at the tipple as a picker. The boys were having some fun and young Hewitt stumbled into the chute. The huge cog wheels caught the fingers of the right arm and in a twinkling the arm to the elbow was mangled horribly. The tippie boss hurried to the boy's assistance and with difficulty released him. He was taken to the Fernie hospital where the arm was amputated above the elbow.

On Saturday night last considerable excitement was caused at Morrissey Mines by the burglarizing of the Crow's Nest Trading Co's store. The offender gained admittance by breaking through the window. A search the following morning revealed the loss of a number of articles from the store. Constable Sampson, who took the matter up without loss of time captured John Devine at the Junction at

six o'clock the next evening. He suspected Devine and a lost watch-chain bar gave him the necessary clue. The stolen goods were found on him and in his valises. Constable Sampson brought his man to Fernie for trial.

### POUND LAW BEING ENFORCED.

Jas. Wallace was appointed pound-keeper and dog-catcher at Monday's meeting of the council. He has built a pound at the rear of his lot and is now ready for business. His first prize was captured on Wednesday night, and many others are likely to follow unless prompt action is taken by the owners of troublesome animals. In another column may be found a copy of the pound and dog-tax by-law. A careful perusal of its different clauses by all citizens is to be desired as it affects most residents in some manner.  
The Board of Police Commissioners met this week. The police appointments made by the Mayor were confirmed, Chief Warring at a salary of \$100 and Constable Burrows at \$75 per month. A Joyce was appointed jailer at \$75 per month.
