today:
New York, June 18.—At the opening there was a good deal of animation and a fair display of strength. Pen-
sylvania being the leader, owing to cov-
ering of shorts and scattered commission
house buying. The traders were decid-
edly bullish and were free buyers around
the noon. The upward movement was
checked by the sudden development of
weakness in the steel stocks. Both com-
mon and preferred broke sharply, their
sellers being room traders, who were
successful subsequently in reaching a
good many stop orders. There was no
reliable news, but there were rumors
that cuts had been made in the prices
of iron and steel products. Another weak
stock was Metropolitan, the statement
made by Mr. Vreeland in regard to the
earnings in 1901 and 1902 having started a
bad impression. The market generally
sold off rather easily, and buying com-
mences scarce; in fact, the market is, if
possible, more professional than yester-
day. Sales to some \$20,000 shares.
