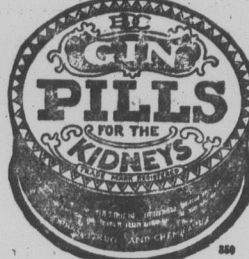

DEAD IN ST. JOHN

Was the President of Manchester, Robertson, Allison, Limited.



J. F. ROBERTSON, of 1010 W. J. St. John, N. B., Jan. 18.—James F. Robertson, president of the Manchester, Robertson, Allison, Limited, large drygoods house here, died early this morning at his residence, No. 4 Carlton Street, after a brief illness. He had been confined to the house for the last ten days, but a fatal termination to his illness was not anticipated. About ten o'clock last night he took a turn for the worse and about 2:30 o'clock this morning he passed away. He was in his 82nd year.

Mr. Robertson was one of the best known business men in the Maritime Provinces and his death makes the first break in the trio that was formed 55 years ago as the company and has developed into the largest mercantile house in the Maritime Provinces. He is survived by his wife and four daughters. The daughters are Mrs. T. E. G. Armstrong, of St. John, Mrs. M. A. Curry, of Halifax; Mrs. H. F. Puddington, an Mrs. H. A. Holmes, of Toronto.

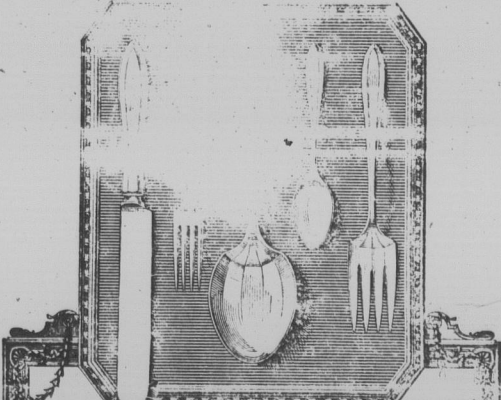
