Game Laws Amendments.

During the present session of the legislature, amendments to the game laws have been made. A summary places the following as the open seasons for various kinds of game in this province:
Open season for deer—From Nov. 5 to 20.
Moose and cariboo season—South of the main line of the C.P.R., Nov. 5 to 20, and north of that line, from Oct. 21 to Nov. 20.

Grouse, pheasants, prairie fowl, partridge, woodcock—Sept. 15 to Dec. 15.
Quail, wild turkeys, black and grey squirrels—Nov. 1 to Dec. 1.
Swans and geese—Sept. 15 to April 30.
Ducks and other water fowl—Sept. 1 to Dec. 31.
Capercaillie—Sept. 15 to Dec. 15.
Hares—Oct. 1 to Dec. 31.


Postal Changes.

The text of the amendment to the postal convention between Canada and the United States, as agreed upon two weeks ago by the Postmaster-Generals of the two countries, has been handed out. The new treaty goes into force on May 8th next and shall continue in force until terminated by mutual agreement or annulled at the instance of the Postoffice Department of either country upon six months' previous notice given to the other. The main treaty of the provision is as follows:—"The postage applicable to second-class matter in each country addressed for delivery in the other shall be one cent for each four ounces or fraction of four ounces, calculated on the weight of each package and prepaid by means of stamps affixed. When separately addressed copies intended for delivery at one post-office are enclosed under one wrapper bearing the address of such office the individual copies shall be delivered without further charge to the respective addressee, the amount of postage thereon at the above rate being fixed to the bulk package."
