DEPARTMENT OF INLAND REVENUE

An Act respecting Agricultural Fertilizers.

HE public is hereby notified that the provisions of the Act respecting AGRICUL TURAL FERTILIZERS came into force on the 1st of January, 1886, and that all Fertilizers sold thereafter require to be sold subject to the conditions and restrictions therein contained the main features of which are as follows:-

The expression "fertilizer" means and includes all fertilizers which are sold at more than TES DLLARS per ton, and which contains ammonia of its equivalent of introgen, or phosphoric action.

By the service of the manufacturer or importer of fertilizers for sale, shall, in the course of the month of January in each year, and before offertilizers for sale, shall, in the course of the month of January in each year, and before offertilizer for sale, stansant to the Minister of Inland Revenue, to read a saled glass jot, containing at least two pounds of the fertilizer manufactured or imported by him, with the certificate of analysis of the same, together with an affair average sample of the fertilizer manufactured or imported by him, and such cample shall be preserved by the Minister of Inland Revenue for the purpose of comparison with any sample of fertilizer which is obtained in the course of the twelve month; then next ensuing from such manufacturer or importer, and which is transmitted to the chief analysis for analysis.

If the fertilizer is put up in packages, every such package intended for sate or distribution within Canada shall have the manufacturer's certificate of analysis placed upon or securely attached to each package by the manufacturer; if the fertilizer is in largs, it shall be distinctly stamped or printed upon each bag; if it is in larrels, it shall be either branded, stamped or printed upon the head of each larrel, or distinctly printed upon good paper and securely pasted upon the head of each larrel, or upon a tag securely, attached to the head of each larrel, if it is in bulk, the manufacturer's certificate shall be produced and it copy given to each purchase.

No fertilizer shall be sold or offered or exposed for sale unless a certificate of analysis and sample of the same shall have been transmitted to the Minister of Inland Revenue, and the provisions of the foregoing subsection have been complied with.

Livery person who sells, or offers or exposes for sale, any fertilizer, in respect of which the provisions of this Act have not been so uplied with or who permits a certificate of analysis to be attached to any package, log or harrel of such fertilizer, or to be produced to the impostor, to accompany the bill; of impostor, stating that the fertilizer contains a larger percentage of the constituents, will be received at this Office up to moon out mentioned in sub-section. No. 11 of the Act than is contained therein—or whosels, offers or exposes for sale, any fertilizer purporting to have been inspected, and which does not contain the percentage of constituents mentioned in the next preceding section—or who sells, or offers or exposes for sale, any fertilizer which does not contain the percentage of conditients mentioned in the manufacturers certificate accompanying the same. Lall be liable in each case to a penalty not exceeding fifty dollars for the first offersor, and for each subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.
