The work on the vascularization of an avascular membrane, for which I believe I am responsible, and to which reference was made, applies quite as well to the conjunctiva as to the iris, and, as anyone interested in ophthalmic pathology will admit, is substantial support to a great many of the practical features which have been brought forward in this paper.

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
