close of the account for the year stands a balance of \$20,00 in the treasurer's hands.

During the summer the Society employed six missionaries, one French and five English, as follows: two in Stephen and Hay; one at Port Severn; one in Penetanguishene; one at Bruce Mines and Sault St. Marie; and one at Fort William. Of the two last named, it may be said that this has been the commencement of a Presbyterian mission in both, and the encouragement which the missionaries received has led the Home Mission Committee to continue the supply during the winter.

The reports from nearly every one of these stations were highly satisfactory and encouraging, showing that the people felt grateful for the interest taken in them, and appreciated the labours of the missionaries. In nearly all, something was raised for the funds of the Society; in one or two sums equal to more than half the salary of the missionary, and in one an amount even exceeding the

whole of what would be required for that purpose.
