

**FOR SORE THROAT.**—One of the most celebrated physicians of England directs the following for sore throat: Camphor ice, spread over a small piece of muslin; on this sprinkle lightly cayenne pepper; over this again add a little more camphor ice. Almost instant relief will be afforded by applying this to the throat.

**A GOOD DENTIFRICE.**—Dissolve two ounces of borax in three pints of boiling water; before quite cold add one tablespoonful of spirits of camphor. Use the mixture for use. Add one wineglassful of the solution to half a pint of tepid water, and use it daily. It preserves and beautifies the teeth.

**HAIRS IN HOUSE CLEANING.**—Provide ammonia for cleaning paint and carpets, the water when done with to be poured on house plants or vines; cold tea for graining; a window scrub, which is a little tea brush with a long handle; a step-ladder; a carpet-stretcher; a self-wringing mop, which consists of a long handle with a stationary ring which moves freely up and down the handle, strips of cloth being pulled to these rings, and the movable ring being sewed up when in use as far as the cloth will permit around the handle till the cloth is wrung dry; pumice stone to remove marks from hard-finished walls; plenty of soft clean muslin and linen for cloths, a chambray-skin to polish mirrors and plate-glass; long-enduring, exhaustless patience, and uninterrupted flow of good humor. With these the labor and discomfort of house cleaning will be reduced to a minimum.


