

DUELLING IN FRANCE.

PARIS, June 28.—Two of the most incorrigible duellists of the day, Henri Rochefort and Paul de Cassagnac, are again at loggerheads. Rochefort is expecting a challenge from a Captain Brown whom he insulted the other day had a visit from the second of his old and deadly enemy, M. THE COMET.

The comet which is nightly visible in the north-eastern part of the heavens, is not attracting much attention outside of astronomical circles, despite the alarm and fears of the superstitious portion of the community, as a rule accompanying the advent of these strange heavenly bodies.

Besides the actual observation of it by the naked eye, the comments of some of the most eminent astronomers of the continent are interesting.

At the present time, Dr. Peters of Litchfield Observatory, Hamilton College, Ohio, thinks that it is the comet seen by Lord Crawford, about 13 degrees from the sun, in Europe on June 9, and, on account of the position of the comet, it cannot be the comet of 1812, and still less that of 1808. At the Cambridge Observatory it is estimated that the comet is moving away from the earth at the rate of 300,000 miles a day. The nucleus is probably a thousand miles in diameter and the inner head twelve thousand, while the corona is vast. The tail is at least four million miles long. Prof. Swift, of Rochester, N. Y., says the comet grows smaller and brighter in the nucleus, showing that it is approaching the sun, and thinks it will be visible for several weeks, but he cannot yet determine if the comet has ever been seen before. Many other opinions are expressed by high authorities, but all tend to the belief that the stranger is travelling towards the sun and receding from the earth.
