THE ROYAL VISIT TO IRELAND. LONDON, March 10.—The programme of the visit of the Prince and Princess of Wales to Ireland is published. The Prince and Princess will reach Dublin on April 8th. On the 9th they will hold a levee at the Castle on behalf of the Queen on the 10th a State ball will be given, and on the 11th a State banquet.
