

At the International Conference for the Buoyage and Lighting of Coasts held at Lisbon on October 7, 1930, under the auspices of the League of Nations, Canada was represented by Mr. J. G. Macphail, Commissioner of Lights, Department of Marine.

The business of the Passport Office continues to be maintained in undiminished volume. For the year ending December 31, 1930, there were issued 29,556 new passports and 3,194 renewals. The income derived from passport fees amounted to \$153,465.79. Visas granted during the year numbered 383 and the revenue from visa fees amounted to \$766.25.
