1. When were the armouries in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, built?
 2. When was the last major addition built to such armouries?

Mr. Blanchette:

1. No information.
 2. No major addition has been made in recent years but the armoury has been kept in good repair and, from time to time, additional facilities have been provided to keep it up to standard. For instance, in 1950 pre-fabricated storage sheds were added, in 1951 a new heating system was installed and in 1952 the roof was renewed.
