Question No. 2,542-Mr. Isabelle:

What was the estimated cost to the different government departments for the preparation of the following answers to questions numbered 2,060, 2,063 and 2,070 (answered November 23, 1966), 2,069 (answered November 16, 1966), 1,860 (answered November 9, 1966), 2,024 (answered November 2, 1966), 1,996 (answered October 26, 1966), 1,894 (an-swered October 19, 1966), 1,871, 1,891 and 1,896 (answered October 12, 1966), 1,793, 1,840, 1,872 and 1,880 (answered October 5, 1966)?

Hon. Judy V. LaMarsh (Secretary of State): It is not possible to estimate the cost of answering questions on the order paper or to determine how many people are engaged in research involved in answering these questions. All departments have an official assigned to deal with parliamentary inquiries and to procure the required information from the appropriate division or divisions of the department and/or the crown corporations. concerned: 1. No.

Answering some questions may involve a number of people and represent many man days of labour. In many cases the information requested is not available at the departmental headquarters in Ottawa and must be requested from regional offices or centres in one or all ten provinces or from Canadian offices abroad to compile data.
