Mr. Boulanger—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—What are the names, duties and salaries of employees of the Department of Agriculture of Quebec who carry out work controlled and paid for by the federal Department of Agriculture?

Mr. Boulanger—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY— What amounts have been paid by the Federal Government, since April 1, 1936, to date, to each province, in connection with Old Age Pensions?

Mr. Boulanger—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—According to the latest statistics, what is: (a) the present population of each province of Canada; (b) the railway mileage in each province; (c) the number of inhabitants per railway mile in each province; (d) the percentage of population of each province with respect to the total population of Canada; (e) the percentage of railway mileage in each province in proportion to the total railway mileage in the Dominion?
