

"That as at present advised the Committee strongly favors erecting a Memorial in the University Quadrangle (South of the Dining Hall and at the head of University Avenue) believing that this site is the most central and the most appropriate in the University; and that the Committee is prepared to secure plans for a Memorial on this site as soon as it has been formally approved by the Yale Corporation and its architectural advisers."

The Executive Committee on Memorials has endorsed this location. The Committee now rests with the Corporation to await the report on Future Architectural Development of the University of its new Committee on Architectural Plans.

It is the strong feeling of those who have given this subject their careful thought that, in order that the Memorial correctly interpret the spirit and feeling of the men and the cause for which the Memorial is to be erected, the project be executed now, at once, while all the patriotic fervor, the sternness, the horror, the dread and the elation of the days we have just passed through, and the peril so dearly averted, are part and parcel of our being.

It is the high privilege of this Committee to be called upon to raise this fund of \$150,000, as outlined in the foregoing Resolutions. For the purpose of bringing this to the knowledge of every Yale man a copy of this appeal is being sent out to every Yale graduate and undergraduate the world over.

But for the actual collection of funds it is deemed most important that different Alumni groups accept definite responsibilities and for Yale men to be canvassed by the Alumni Association located in the district where they live, and that subscriptions be sent to the central Committee through the person designated by each Alumni Association for the reception of contributions.

Your name has therefore been given to the Alumni Association in your district and you may expect to hear from them in a day or two.

We urge upon you that you make a prompt response. Should anything happen that you do not hear directly, you may send your check, made payable to the order of Frederic W. Allen, Treasurer, mailing it to the Headquarters of the Committee, and your contribution will be credited to the Association in which you are assigned.

Above all, it is the hope that every Yale man shall have a part in the undertaking; that each shall give in such amount as his circumstances shall warrant, but that all shall give in singleness of purpose and spirit.
