FARM RESERVES ABOVE ESTIMATE

Government Report Didn't In-
clude Spring Seed Re-
quirements.

CHICAGO, March 27.—Discovery that the government report on farm reserves does not include spring seed requirements, which are 27,000,000 bushels, caused general selling to slow, which went westward. The price was weak at a net loss of 1-4c to 1-2c; corn suffered a net loss of 1-4c, and oats 1-2c to 1-4c. Provisions closed a shade lower to 10c higher. Next to the farm reserve report the wheat situation was influenced mostly by the fact that millers who usually buy a great deal of their grain in this market were holding off because the floods in Ohio and Indiana were preventing shipments. Absence of any material short interest left oats with poor support.

The run of hogs in the west was 14,000 less than a year ago, and the provision list was comparatively dull.
