Priests, Old Men and Children Butchered in Town of Asia Minor.

Turks of one hundred Greeks, including priests, old men and children, in the Town of Phokia, twenty-five miles northwest of Smyrna. The town, according to the official report, was inaccording to the official report, was invaded by a horde of armed men, who looted and then set fire to all the buildings. They are said to have been assisted by the Turkish police. All the inhabitants, most of whom were Greeks, fled, leaving their property behind them, and 3800 of them have reached Saloniki. They declare that the bodies of the massacred people the bodies of the massacred people were thrown into wells. The refugees, many of whom were suffering from wounds, were in a state of starvation on their arrival at Saloniki.
