ENGLISH GOLF COURSES.

An indication of the manner in which the war spirit is affecting the average Englishman may be gleaned from the kind of resolution that has been passed at more than one loyal British golf club. The resolution adopted by the Burnhill Golf Club, one of the London courses, voices the prevailing ideas about as delicately and politely, but at the same time as firmly and unmistakably, as they could be expressed. It reads as follows: "That members of this club, whether Austrian birth and parentage, whether naturalised or not, are requested, for their own comfort and that of the members, to abstain from wearing the swastika during the continuance of the war."
