George Devlin, all totally consumed. The
latter building was owned by Mr. McNight who
occupied the upper storey; contents were con-
sumed; the building was insured for \$975. Mr.
North, loss about \$2,500; insured for \$1,700;
Mr. Timms is insured for \$1,700, which will not
cover the loss. Office of Mr. McBeath, lumber
merchant, also destroyed; insured. *Eastons*,
27.—Thos. Atkinson's barns with contents
destroyed by bush fires. Loss \$1,500. The
fires are still raging, and other buildings are in
danger. *Prescott*, 29.—Mr. Hough's saw mill
and sash and door factory totally destroyed,
with contents, also the lumber sheds adjoining,
containing a large quantity of lumber and
shingles. Loss on mill and machinery about
\$7,000; insured for \$2,000 in the Standard Fire
of Hamilton and for \$5,000 in the Manhattan
Insurance Company of New York. The follow-
