

Mr. Wiswall, Missionary at Wilmot, represents that his Church is in a more prosperous way than before, and better attended. That Mr. Copley resigned the School in April last; since which Mr. Augustus Willoughby, a very fit person, has undertaken it, whom Mr. Wiswall therefore recommends to the Society, who have accordingly adopted him. That he expects soon to receive from Government a grant of 400 acres of land, contiguous to the Glebe, for the sole benefit of a School-master of the Church of England in trust to the Rector and Churchwardens of the parish of Wilmot.

The Rev. Mr. Shreve, Missionary at Lunenburg, in his letter of December 31, 1809, is happy to say, that the Church in that place still continues to encrease. That his parishioners desire to return their sincere thanks to the Society for the appointment of Mrs. Breyzilius as School-mistress there. She has given great satisfaction by her attention to her charge, which consists of more than twenty children, who are catechized at Church on Sunday Afternoons during the summer season. His Notitia for the year 1809 is, as follows: Baptisms 52; Marriages 18; Burials 10. Communicants 140. Children catechized 35.
