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MERCHANTS' MOVES TO KING

Is Well-Founded Rumor—Current—Were the Purchasers of Dominion Permanent Building.

It is learned that the purchaser of Nos. 12, 14 and 16 West King-street, which changed hands about a month ago, was the Merchants' Bank. The property is in the heart of the financial district and adjoins the Home Bank. It has a frontage of 54 feet on King-street.

The property was formerly owned by the Lister estate, the solicitors for which are Foy and Kelly, to whom the tenants paid their rents. These have now been notified to make their payments to the firm of Smith, Rae & Green, who are stated to be the solicitors for the Merchants' Bank.

The lease of the property is owned by the Dominion Permanent Loan Co., which occupies the eastern portion of the ground floor, and sub-leased the other part to the firm of Erickson Perkins & Co., New York stock brokers. The lease is for ten years, but three years have now been used. The Dominion Permanent has been offered a substantial sum to assign the lease, the offer having been increased by \$6000 last week, but the offer is not yet sufficiently tempting. The Merchants' Bank is now located at 12 West Wellington-street.

Cawthras Sell Land
On King St. West
For \$415,000

Numbers 9, 11 and 13, Running Thru to Melinda, Said to Have Been Bought for New Financial Institution.

Involving \$415,000, of which a third is cash, a deal was closed Saturday for the purchase of the Cawthras property at Nos. 9, 11, 13 West King-street. The purchaser is thought to be A. G. C. Dinick.

The property will in all probability be used as the chief office of a new financial institution which has been in process of formation for some months.

The property purchased is in the centre of the city's financial life, and has for long been considered a most desirable piece of property, but all offers of purchase have been consistently refused. It has been situated in the market for the last two weeks at \$415,000.

The property runs right back to Melinda-street, there being a frontage of 50 feet on both streets.

Victor Cawthras, who is agent for the many Cawthras estate holdings told the Melinda Saturday morning that negotiations were on for the purchase of this property.

Godard Farm in North Toronto
Changes Hands at Over \$2000 an Acre.

One more piece of property in the big commercial area has been purchased at \$500 a foot. The property is on the northeast corner of Adelaide and Duncan-streets, and has a frontage of 55 feet. Fred Bridgen of Ross-avenue was the owner, but he declines to give the name of the purchaser. The total price paid for the lot was \$27,500.

North Toronto Farm Sold.
The Godard farm, at the northeast corner of Bayview and Boudan-avenue, has been sold to Kenneth McWhinney at a price said to be \$2200 an acre. The farm contains 16 acres. It will probably be subdivided.

C. N. R. EARNINGS.

The Canadian Northern Railway's gross earnings for the week ending March 7 are \$212,800 as compared to \$233,400 for the corresponding week of last year.

These figures show a substantial increase of \$20,400 in the company's receipts. The earnings of this railway have been increasing since July 1 at the rate of \$2,172,300 over the same period of the year previous.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, who has been a resident of a Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$100 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon a homestead or pre-emption for each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500.
