Cubs Make it Three Straight Trim Tigers in Detroit Jungle

Cobb Scores Only Run for Tigers, While Cubs Annex Six—Overall and Donovan the Opposing Pitchers.

DETROIT, Mich., Oct. 11.—In the first game of the world's series on their own field to-day, the Detroit American League team was beaten by the Chicago Cubs, who won by the score of 6 to 1. It was a well-deserved victory by the Chicago team, because the nine played superior baseball the entire game. There were several errors by the Detroit team, besides the two errors scored against them, which figured in Chicago's run-making.

It was anything but baseball weather this afternoon. The temperature ranged between 46 and 50 degrees, and a cold, 12-mile wind from the north blew across the diamond. Several times there were showers, one of which, while Chicago was at bat in the fifth inning, was so heavy that it was necessary to interrupt play for fifteen minutes.

In the seventh inning there was another downpour, but it did not last long enough to interrupt the game. The attendance was a disappointment, reaching only 11,306. The raw, cold day probably reduced the attendance, and dissatisfaction with the arrangements governing the sale of tickets. Detroit bunched hits in the fourth and fifth innings, but only one run resulted. O'Leary striking out with the bases full.

The Detroit team did not, as a team, exhibit the snap and dash which marked its playing during the American League playoffs season here. Roseman kept up his work at first base and drove in Detroit's only run with a single, after Cobb had tripled. Donovan gave two bases on balls, the same number as Overall did, but both of the Detroit pitcher's passes were turned into runs, whereas neither of Overall's was costly.

Captain Chance of the Chicago team was hit on the right hand by a line shot while at bat in the opening inning, and his second and third fingers were badly crushed. The game was stopped while they were dressed, but Captain Chance said to-night that he feared the injury might prevent his playing to-morrow.

Manager Jennings Receives Reward. Just before play was called at 3 o'clock, Manager Hugh Jennings was called to the plate where Mayor Thompson presented him with a life-sized local baseball and a gold watch, gifts from local admirers.

In the first inning Slagle filed out and Sheppard followed with a single, only to be thrown out when he tried to steal second. Chance was hit with the ball and this second, but Steinfield's fly ended the inning. Jones, the first man to bat for Detroit, was given a base on balls, and Schaeffer sacrificed, getting him to second, but neither Crawford nor Cobb succeeded in batting the ball safely, and the Cubs went out in the second. In one-two-three fashion in the second inning, Coughlin singled in Detroit's half, and Roseman was out on an infield grounder. Tinker then retired the side, unassisted by catching Schmidt's liner to him and touching Coughlin before he could start back to first.

Chicago did not get a man on base in their half of the third inning. Detroit went out in regular order in the third, Schlitz making a fine catch of Donovan's hit to right field. He got the ball on the bound and threw the runner out on what ordinarily would have been a single. Steinfield hit safely in the fourth, but failed to score.

Then, in the fourth, Detroit scored its only run. With two out, Cobb drove a splendid triple to left, and then Coughlin singled, scoring him. Then Coughlin singled and Schmidt got a base on balls. The crowd went wild as the Cubs advanced both men with a sacrifice. Overall scored Evers, and Slagle's fly to Jones brought Schlitz, Sheppard forced Overall. Detroit went out in regular order in its half.

Cubs Score Three. Neither team scored in the sixth, although Schlitz singled, with but one out, Tinker tried to sacrifice, bunting to Donovan. The pitcher threw high to second to catch Schlitz, and both were safe. Overall advanced them with a sacrifice.
