Steamships in Trouble.

London, Jan. 13.—The British ship Brablock, Capt. Kiddle, from San Francisco, Aug. 29, via Queenstown, for Liverpool, stranded in a dense fog last evening off Alnwich. She lay in a dangerous position, but was finally finauled off and towed to Holyhead. She sustained no apparent damage by grounding.

A despatch from Manila says that while the British ship Celeste Burrille, Capt. Trefry, was loading there for New York, fire was discovered on board, but the flames were extinguished before much darfage was done. Two hundred bales of the cargo were somewhat damaged by fire and water.

While the Italian barque Elena G., Capt. Garibaldi Athpilanac, from Philadelphia, was discovered in her hold, and all efforts to extinguish the flames have so far proved fruitless.


