### WARDEN'S WIFE WAS OUTRAGE

Infatuated With One of the Biddles, She Supplied Murderers With Saws and Revolvers

### BOLD ESCAPE FROM PITTSBURG JAIL

One Guard Shot and With Two Others Locked in a Dungeon—Captives Go Free.

### THREE GUARD OVER RAIL

Shortly before 4 o'clock one of the Biddles called to James McGeary, who had charge of the outside gates, and asked for some cramp medicine.

### SHOT ANOTHER GUARD

Edward Biddle joined his brother immediately, and both, with drawn revolvers, hurried to the first floor, where they met Guard Reynolds and shot him.

### ESCAPE DISCOVERED AT DAYLIGHT

The escape was not discovered until the daylight guards came on duty at 6 o'clock. They were informed by prisoners where the night guards had been put, and they were soon released from the dungeon and sent to the hospital.

### WARDEN'S WIFE DID IT

The story of the matter is brief. Mrs. Soffel was the only person admitted to the jail since last Sunday. Yesterday she went to the kitchen to respond to a call from the warden's office.

### SAVED DURING THE NIGHT

Nothing suspicious was noticed in the actions of the two prisoners, nor was anything wrong discovered when the day guards went off duty yesterday afternoon.

### REWARD OF \$5000 OFFERED

A reward of \$5000 has been offered for the recapture of the murderers. No trace has been found of Mrs. Soffel.

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### OPPORTUNITY TO CONTROL A LINE FROM ATLANTIC TO GREAT LAKES

London, Jan. 30.—The Evening Journal, which at first commented upon the purchase of the Canada Atlantic Railway by the Vanderbilts as a boom to the country, has now done some thing figuring, and incidentally some thing as well, and this is the result of its mature deliberations, as set forth editorially: "According to the official return of the Canada Atlantic system for 1909, the net earnings that the company has made during the year, over and above operating expenses, were \$393,036. This is the amount available therefore to pay interest on the capital liability. The first charge was the bonds, \$4,450,000, on which 5 per cent, or \$222,500, had to be paid. Next would come the preferred stock, \$1,000,000, on which the interest, we suppose, would be 6 per cent, or \$60,000. Thus upon bonds and preferred stock \$282,500 would be payable, leaving out of the net earnings the sum of \$110,536 to pay a dividend upon the common stock, namely, less than 14 per cent. Under the circumstances it is not at all likely that the Vanderbilts, who have paid half of the stock, not probably more than the Dominion, so at some rate, the Dominion shareholders might have obtained a complete railway from the Atlantic Ocean to the 'Great Lakes'."
