SERVICE BADGES OF CLASS DARE BEING ISSUED

First Arrive at Local Militia Headquarters for Distribution.

PENALTY FOR MISUSE

Great Care Taken to See Only Those Entitled to Recognition Get One.

The first of the new war service badges to be assued by the Canadian

Government arrayed at district head-quarters Friday.

Contrary to the expectation of the authorities here, the badges which ar-rived from Ottawa today are Class D, while no sign of the arrival of the Class while no sign of the arrival of the Class A badges is apparent as yet.

The Class D badge is that which will be issued on application to all those who before August 17, 1917, tried to entist and were unable to do so on account of physical disability, and also to those who were discharged through physical unfitness after less than three months' service in the C. E. F. in Canada.

The new badge is a beautiful one. It is of bronze metal, bears the coat of arms of Canada, which stands in relief in the centre over a dark red ground. On the outer edge are the words "Honorably Exempt."

\$500 Penalty For Misuse.

The reverse side bears the serial number in large and unmistalable figures, and the wirds, "Penalty for misuse, \$500, or six months' imprisonment."

Accompanying each badge is a certificate containing the name of the owner, and a brief description of him, so that he may be easily identified. The certificate also states that the wearer must be ready at all times to produce the certificate, if asked to do so by a military or peace officer.

The badges are sent in a sealed envelope with the certificate from Ottaws, and when they arrive at district head-quarters, Major C. O. Fairbank, who is in charge of the issue of war service badges for this district, notifies the owner, and the latter may either call and receive the badge personally or have it sent by registered letter.

Only a limited number were received today, about a half dozen in all, and those whose badges have not arrived can only wait until their turn comes.

Thorough Investigation.

The work of inquiring into the evidence submitted in each case, to show that the applicant is entitled to a badge is tremendous, and consequently only a few can be issued at one time. Great care is being taken to see that no badges are issued to those who are not fully entitled to the wearer would be destroyed if it became known that they were being worn indiscriminately, hence the extra precautions. In some cases the patriotic fund badges issued to those who had served overseas, were lost, sold, or stolen, and for this reason, they do not carry the significance they should.


Dish Water "Mine" Being Discovered By Dr Stevenson

Ex-Mayor Has Scheme to Make Greases Out of Waste.

Ex-Mayor H. A. Stevenson is out with a suggestion that devices be installed to extract grease and other materials from dish water. He declares that thousands of dollars can be made in this way, and glyeroine in large quantities manufactured. He points out that the British are making a great deal of money in this way.

"An English expert came to the aviation camp in Toronto, and by installing a simple process is making \$200 a month out of dish water," said Dr. Stevenson. "A similar machine could be installed at Victoria Hospital, and an equal amount saved, I am sure.

"This is something that should be taken up, as there are infinite possibilities along that line."
