WITH THE AMERICAN ARMIES IN THE FIELD, Oct. 16 .- The elements of the German army opposing the Americans have been told that all plans for an armistice and the withdrawal from the occupied territory have now been arranged. The plan embraces the withdrawal of the German troops twenty kilometres, while the Allied armies withdraw ten kilometres. Then with a neutral strip of thirty kilometres between the armies the general withdrawal commences, the Allied armies halting ten kilometres from the German frontiers until peace is signed.
