GERMAN SOLDIERS HAVE BEEN TOLD AMBASSADE'S ALREADY ARRANGED

WITH THE AMERICAN ARMIES IN THE FIELD, Oct. 16.-The elements of the German army opposing the Americans have been told that all plans for an armistice and the withdrawal from the occupied territory have now been arranged. The plan embraces the withdrawal of the German troops twenty kilometers, while the Allied armies withdraw ten kilometers. Then with a neutral strip of thirty kilometers between the armies the general withdrawal commences, the Allied armies halting ten kilometers from the German frontiers until peace is signed.

An American sergeant, captured by the Germans Wednesday, was taken a considerable distance to the German rear by his captors, given discusser's ration, and then returned to his captors. He said that the war would soon be over and they didn't want to bother with prisoners. The sergeant rejoined our lines at darkness without difficulty.

RUSSIAN RAPID REGIONS OF BELGIUM; ALLIES IN PURSUIT

British Forces Have Gained at All Points Between Douai and Lille-French Cavalry Is Approaching Thiel, Seven Miles From Ghent-Bruges Canal.

WITH THE ALLIED ARMIES IN BELGIUM, Oct. 16.-(By the Associated Press)-4:30 p.m.-The Germans have started a retreat on a tremendous scale from Northern Belgium. French cavalry is approaching Thiel, seven miles from the banks of the Ghent-Bruges canal. The canal itself is only ten miles from the border of Holland.

So fast is the enemy retreating that the French, British and Belgian infantry, at least in the centre of the battlefield, have lost touch entirely with the enemy.

Great streams of enemy traffic began moving last night and continued today on the roads around Courtrai and Harlebeke and on the railways running northeast.

The trench mortars and direct machine gun fire are seriously hampering the enemy transport in its attempt to get the material away through the mud.

BOLSHEVIKI ARMIES AND THE ALLIES ARE AT GRIPS ON DVINA

Americans Are Taking Part in Battle. ALLIES IN TIGHT PLACE

Receding River Favors the Enemy, Who Is Losing Nevertheless.

CHICAGO, Oct. 17.-Fresh strength developed in the corn market today as a result of the denial of reports that Germany had capitulated. Buying was of great volume, and there were numerous temporary reactions. Talk of the possibility that a minimum price on corn would be established acted somewhat as a bullish factor. Opening prices ranged from the same as yesterday's finish to 3/4c higher.

Oats kept pace with corn. After opening 1/2c to 3/4c up with November at 80c, the market fluctuated, but finally, but did not get far either way from initial figures.
