NOTABLE PETFORMANCES.

TRIGGER.

100 single birds tame doves killed in succession in two hours. A H Bogardus, Chicago, July 21st, 1869. 99 birds out of 100 single, Bogardus, 30 yards rise, 80 yards fall, five ground traps, 1½ oz shot, 10 bore, 10 lb 6 oz gun, English rules, Coney 1sland, July 2nd, 1880. 300 glass balls broken in succession, Bogardus, Lincoln, Ill., July 4th, 1877.

70 pigeons out of 100 by Charles Brown, a boy only 8 yrs old, 4ft high, 66 lb weight, at 18 yards rise, 80 yards fall, 3 traps, 5 yards apart, at fast blue rock pigeons, at Nott ingham, England, Jan. 25, 1883.

500 glass balls broken in 24 min, 2 sec, out of 514 shot at. by J C Haskett match against time, 25 min 15 sec, two Bogardus traps, 12ft apart, 14 yards rise, at Lynn, Mass., May 30th, 1881.

501 clay pigeons broke in 34 min 7 sec, out of 543 shot at, by Bogardus, loading his own guns, one bird sprung at a time and thrown from three to ten feet above the ground, several traps; 444 pigeons in 30 min, at Cincinnati, O, April 15th, 1882.

1000 glass balls broken in 1h 1 min 54 sec, by Bogardus, using two sets of barrels. 15 yards, two traps, twelve feet apart, at New York City, Dec. 20th, 1879.

5,500 glass balls broken in 7h 19 min 2 sec, out of 5,854 shot at, by Bogardus, at 15 yards, two traps, twelve feet apart, loading his own gun and changing barrels about 54 times, New York City, Dec 20th, 1879.

Mr. W B Hunter, of New York, killed 243 ducks in eight hours at Long Point, Ont., in October 1884—This is the largest bag ever made in Canada within the same number of hours and we believe it to be the best on record.

In 1878 Colonel Tisdale, of Simcoe, also shooting at Long Point killed 186 duck between 10 a.m. and 6p.m.

100 Clay Pigeons out of a possible 100 by W F Carver at Des Moines, Iowa.

Clay Pigeon shoot—100 each, 30 yards rise, Carver 94, Bogardus 94 at Dayton, O.

.50 double birds (pigeons) 21 yards rise, Bogardus 81, Carver 79.

100 birds (pigeons) 30 yards rise, one barrel, F. Kimball 88. F. Keling 84.

100 birds (pigeons) 2 ground traps, 30 yards rise 80 vards fall, Carver 83, Bogardus 82.
