Italy Seething With Discontent

PARIS, March 23.—According to an interview with a prominent American well acquainted with Italian affairs, who in fact spends part of each year near Milan, but does not wish his name to be made public, it would appear that economic conditions in Italy at present are far worse than the censored despatches make out.

"The Tripoli war," he said, "comes very near being the ruin of Italy, which is, in fact, already seething with anxiety and discontent. Silk exports from Como Province to the east have dwindled down to almost nothing."

"Already the tourist season is affected, and the majority of the hotels are very shaky."
