WHITE OUT ON BAIL

Judge Ritchie Says There is but Slight Presumption of Guilt, and Allows Bail Without Being Asked—Prisoner Pleads Not Guilty.

Harry B. White, the young man charged with forgery by the Dominion Express Company, was committed for trial this morning in the police court, and as the presumption of his guilt was not sufficiently strong, Judge Ritchie, without any plea being made by Mr. McKown, the prisoner's counsel, that he would admit him to bail.
