

TODAY'S BEST RECIPE TO HELP YOU MAKE A SACK OF FLOUR LAST LONGEST

(By Lillian Kemy, Institutional man-ager, Chicago School of Domestic Arts and Science.) Ginger Bread.

Ginger Bread.

This is an extremely economical recipe for a tasty dessert, especially valuable to the housekeeper of modest income, in these days when the flour sack is used up so rapidly. The ingredients are: One-quarter cup butter, one cup sugar, two eggs, half cup molasses, two cups flour, half cup sour milk, one teaspoon soda, half teaspoon cinnamon, and half teaspoon ginger. The total cost, ttemized as in the first day's recipe, is fifteen cents, and the ginger bread serves twelve persons.


