

## HON. GEO. FOWLER IS DEAD IN OTTAWA

New Brunswick Senator  
Passed Away in Capital  
Last Evening.

Ottawa, Sept. 2.—Following an illness of lengthy duration, Lieutenant-Colonel, the Hon. Senator George William Fowler, of Sussex, N. B., died at his local residence at 8.30 this evening.

Senator George W. Fowler had since 1885 been an outstanding figure in the political life of New Brunswick. He was born in Hammondville, about 18 miles from Sussex, 65 years ago and early in life showed that energy and determination that have marked his career. He has been in the House of Commons since 1917 but in later years his health has been indifferent and gave his friends and family much anxiety.

In early life George W. Fowler was a school teacher; afterwards he studied law and for many years was associated with W. B. Jones, now County Court Judge, in legal partnership. Mr. Fowler was an excellent speaker and a good mixer and it was not long before he became warden of Kings county in the municipal council.

Provincial politics were not upon federal party lines in those days and when Mr. Fowler was elected to the Local Legislature in 1896 he was a supporter of the Government led by Andrew G. Blair. Soon afterward the famous Moncton meeting took place and local Conservative members took their place as party men.

Ran Against Dominion.  
The late Senator Dominionville, who had been elected to Ottawa in 1896, found himself opposed by Fowler, the young Sussex lawyer, in 1900. The old member was too confident and Mr. Fowler found himself elected to Ottawa by a small majority. The present Supreme Court Judge, A. S. White, opposed Mr. Fowler in the united constituency of Kings-Albert in 1904 and the latter was again victorious. It was in 1909 that Dr. D. H. McAllister found himself and the Liberal Government in favor in Kings-Albert and Mr. Fowler was defeated. Three years later, however, nothing daunted, Fowler was again a candidate and this time he held the seat until 1917, when he was appointed to the Senate. In 1915 and 1916 Colonel Fowler was busily engaged recruiting men for overseas and he was successful in raising the 10th and 140th battalions which went to the front. The call of the Empire found Col. George W. Fowler, who was nearing 60 years, eager to do his part.

and to lead as many Kings county men as possible to the defence of their country. Upon his return to Canada he was appointed a senator and since then has frequently engaged to defend accused persons in St. John Circuit Court and in Kings and Albert counties there was rarely a sitting of any court in which the firm of which George Fowler was a member was not engaged.

And yet Mr. Fowler, busy as he was with law and politics, was able to devote some time to agriculture. He had a splendid farm and modern buildings at his old home in Hammondville—sometimes called Fowlertown—and there it was his pleasure to spend money for production. He was not only interested in farming but in lumber and owned many tracts in different parts of Kings and Albert counties. In the west Mr. Fowler became interested in coal mines which he afterwards sold and still more recently was an investor in the Porcupine district.

During the summer his family has been living in Brockville, Ont., but the Senator went to Sussex always for a time, practiced his profession and kept up his acquaintance with old friends. During the winter since his senatorial appointment Senator Fowler lived in Ottawa. His death will be learned of with much regret in New Brunswick by his old-time opponents as well as his friends. Fowler was always a hard hitter but never knowingly below the belt. He was a keen campaigner, used more vinegar than oil often to his disadvantage, but his mind was always alert ready to take advantage of his opponent's errors and to make his path as difficult as possible. In Parliament he was too outspoken at times and his political opponents kept ready to return him as good as he sent. When Fowler had the floor in the Commons or the Senate the session was never dull. He did not marry until 1897, when Miss Ethyl G. Wilson became his wife and survives him.

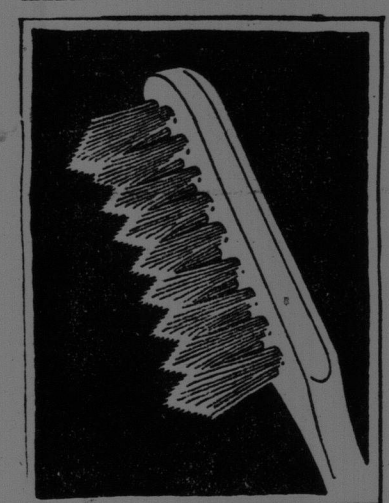

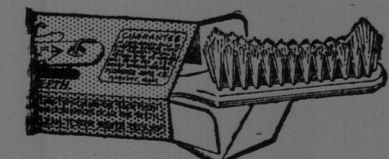
