A party of ten from the University of Chicago will arrive in Montreal today under the direction of Prof. Charles C. Colby. This visit to Montreal is part of a tour of eastern Canada undertaken with the object of studying the geography and other features of the coontry.

The party left Chicago on July 28 by the Canadian Pacific Railway. At Toronto on Saturday they were taken over the city by C. P. R. officials, where they studied, amongst other things, the layout of the city, including its relation to the waterfront; the Don and Humber valleys, the country to the north of the city; the factory districts, especially the agricultural implement factories, and meat-packing houses, the boot and shoe factories, and the Toronto industrial district.

While in Montreal the party will inspect the ocean teruginals, the grain elevators, improvements which have been made in developing the port, factories and refineries, the railway terminal facilities, including the Angus Shops of the C. P. R., and the Lachine Canal.

From Montreal the party goes to Shawinigan Falls, where inspection will be made on August 6 and 7 of the dam and power plant of the Shawinigan Water & Power Coo., the mills of the Belgo Canadian Paper & Pulp Co., the aluminum works, and the carbide works.

Quebec will be visited on August 7 and 8. Interest there will be centred in getting into touch with French-Canadian life. From Quebec the party will go to Fraserville, Kamouraska, Bic and Rimouski. Sydney is scheduled for a visit on August 17, Halifax for August 21 and St. John on August 27.

Q.—In the minds of many people the cause of most forest fires is ascribed to lightning, action of the sun on quartz, broken bottles, etc., and to "spontaneous combustion." How far is this true?

A.—If lighting fires and fires set by broken bottles, etc., were the only menace of the forest, nine-tenths of the fire rangers would lose their jobs. Unfortunately, while lightning sometimes is a minor factor in certain districts, (and now and then it is just possible that broken glass may concentrate the sun's rays and start a blaze) the serious fact we have to bear in mind is that four fires in every five are started by a careless human being. The campfire, the lighted cigarette, land-clearing fires employed by settlers to burn up debris, are responsible for the main losses.

Q.—Is there any Dominion law obliging the railways to guard against setting forest fires?

A.—The control of the privately-own-

forest fires, is amply taken care of by the Board of Railway Commissioners and careful regulations have been drawn up and closely adherred to by which railway fires are being rapidly reduced. The
