WILL BE IN ST. JOHN.

(Montreal Gazette).

A party of ten from the University of Chicago will arrive in Montreal today under the direction of Prof. Charles C. Coby. This visit to Montreal is part of a tour of eastern Canada undertaken with the object of studying the geography and other features of the country.

The party left Chicago on July 25 by the Canadian Pacific Railway. At Toronto on Saturday they were taken over by the city of C. P. R. officials, where they studied, among other things, the layout of the city, including its relation to the waterfront; the Don and Humber valleys; the country to the north of the city; the factory districts, especially the agricultural implement factories, and meat-packing houses, the boot and shoe factories, and the Toronto industrial district.

While in Montreal the party will inspect the ocean terminals, the grain elevators, improvements which have been made in developing the port, factories and refineries, the railway terminal facilities, including the Angus Shops of the C. P. R., and the Lachine Canal.

From Montreal the party goes to Shawinigan Falls, where inspection will be made on August 6 and 7 of the dam and power plant of the Shawinigan Water & Power Co., the mills of the Belgo-Canadian Paper & Pulp Co., the aluminum works, and the caribou works.

Quebec will be visited on August 7 and 8. Interest there will be centered in getting into touch with French-Canadian life. From Quebec the party will go to Frasnerville, Kamouraska, Bic and Rimouski. Sydney is scheduled for a visit on August 17. Halifax for August 21 and St. John on August 27.

government railways are now giving good co-operation in forest fire prevention so that the total losses from railway sources per annum have become a minor factor in Canada's forest destruction. The monthly records sometimes show large numbers of fires set by railways but further enquiry will bring out the fact that the greater number were quickly put out without material damage.

Please give some information as to the forestry policy of the German Empire.

A.—The timber resources of Germany are not only thoroughly protected against forest fires but have been intensively developed by scientific forestry practice so that the forest area is now more timber than comes from the whole of Canada each year and at the same time Germany is rapidly increasing its capital stock of forests. The explanation is that in the last decade the German foresters have been successful in excluding forest fires and in self-reproducing timber crops out of the forest year by year. In the old days "territorial waters" had a certain meaning. The definition depended on the range of a certain canon, and the standard.

It isn't merely that that limit has long been exceeded by the technical devices of the sons of Belial. The real question is: "Shouldn't the liquor traffic on the high seas be suppressed by international co-operation, as the slave trade was suppressed?" In this latter suppression, Great Britain had the principal hand. But all this talk about territorial waters, about the co-operation or want of co-operation of foreign ships, outside the three-mile limit, of "conspicuous" and "smugglings" and so on, is really beside the mark. If the United States wants to end liquor smuggling it can do it. It can make arrangements, not absurd and impossible, but permissible by international law. These violent and emotional laws proposed in Congress, this alteration of the intercourse between nations, not heretofore dependent on the theories of the Middle West, will interest not much the Pollocks and the Stophenses as our own Roscoe Pound and Attorney-General Daugherty.
